The Question Of Addressing Escalating Security Challenges, Specifically Regarding The Proliferation Of Military Coups Within The Sahel Region

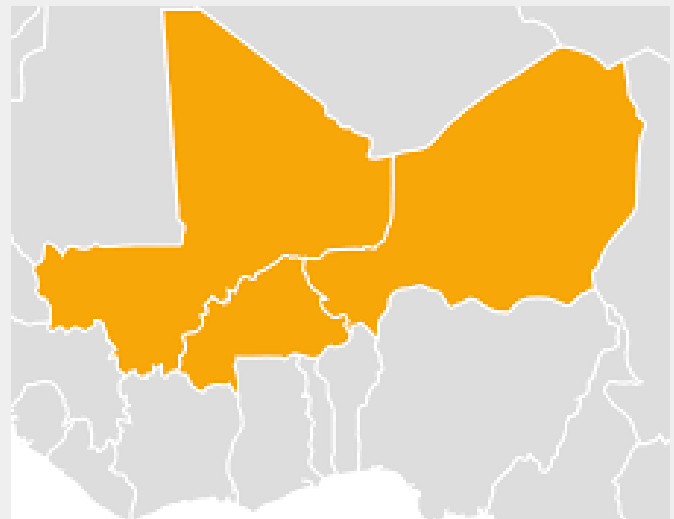
What is this issue and what is going on?
